- 6. Stay in contact with Gold Star families and remember them during all holidays.
- 7. Send cards to members and their families.
- 8. Volunteer in community projects.
- 9. Make a prayer and devotional book.
- 10. Encourage members to send prayers and devotional thoughts so they can be used to make a prayer book.

- ALA was established at the First National Convention of the American Legion in 1919.
- The AL decided to organize their own organization instead of adopting an existing organization.
- The Department of KS was organized by Dept. Adjutant Frank Samuel.
- Department Commander Thomas Lee called the 1st KS Auxiliary Convention in Jan. 1921 in Newton, KS.
- Winifred Calihan of Garden City was elected President
- 181 units the first year
- The rallying slogan was "No Bachelor Post"
- The Auxiliary was organized enough to hold a National Convention in November 1921 in Kansas City, MO.
