Fleur-de-lis - What Does It Mean?

The Fleur-de-lis's literal translation from French is "flower of lily/iris". The Fleur-de-lis traditionally represents French royalty and is said to signify perfection, light and life. One of the legends of the origins of this symbol was given by an angel to signify the King of the Franks, Clovis's purification, upon the conversion to Christianity. The angel presented Clovis with the fleur-de-lis.

Another legend states that Clovis adopted the symbol as it reminded him of the waterlilies that showed him how to safely cross a river allowing him to triumph in battle.

No matter which legend you tend to consider, this symbol has been used to signify French Royalty when it was first adopted by several Frankish Christian Kings including Charlemagne and has been adopted by many nations around the world. In Christianity, lilies symbolize purity and chastity. This is one of the reasons, traditionally, why the fleur-de-lis historically has represented the Virgin Mary.

So, what does this mean to us? This symbol can remind us to be a light in this world and breath of life to those we interact with while working our missions of the American Legion Auxiliary. The purity of our hearts and intentions will carry us through any conflict or trial we face.
