Marching to the Beat of Membership Tracy Kinnick – Department VP

Membership as you know is key to the success of our organization. Without our members helping to advocate for our veterans, where would they be? Where would their families be? We are needed more than ever in this crazy world that appears to have gone mad. It is up to us to make changes for our veterans and their families. The easiest way to do that is to grow our membership, the more members we have the louder our voice with Congress.

Last month there was a quiz in the Sunflower about membership, here are the answers to the questions that were posted. Thank you to those who participated in the quiz,

each of you will receive a Cheryl buck for your participation.

- 1. <u>False</u> Now that males are allowed into the ALA, my brother, whose sister is allowed to join my unit. Only <u>spouses</u> of eligible Legion members are allowed to join the ALA, male or female spouses, must be married to a Legionnaire to join.
- 2. <u>True</u> A female veteran may join the ALA under her own right and does not need to be related to a legionnaire, nor does she have to be a legionnaire herself. This is true a female veteran or active military may join the ALA under herself, she do NOT need to belong to the Legion, nor does she have to have a relative in the Legion to be a member of the ALA.
- 3. **False** A unit secretary can sign the membership application stating post officer. A Post officer for the Legion must sign the ALA membership application.
- 4. <u>True</u> Is a letter related to the veteran's military service valid proof of military service? If the joining member has an official letterhead from the military to the veteran's service, that may be used in place of a DD214 for proof of service.
- 5. <u>False</u>: The potential ALA member may join the ALA under a living eligible relative who does not belong to the Legion. If the potential ALA member is joining under a living relative, the relative must belong to a legion. For example, if a granddaughter is trying to join, if her grandfather is living, he must belong to a legion. However, keep in mind that the legion he belongs to does not have to be in the state of Kansas, the relative just needs to belong to any Legion.
- 6. <u>True</u>: Transmittals must be filled out in alphabetical order. By filling out your unit transmittals in alphabetical order, you are helping the office director to easily do her job without having to bounce back and forth between screens. This allows for fewer mistakes and easier input for our membership.
- 7. <u>False:</u> When signing up a new member, units should send in their original application to the department with their transmittal. Units are now responsible for their membership applications. When signing up a new member, units need to send a copy of the application with payment to the department office. Membership applications are to be held the entire time the member is living.
- 8. <u>False:</u> Great-granddaughters are eligible for the ALA. The IRS sets the membership rule of Two Degrees of Consanguinity for the ALA. Definition of Two Degrees of Consanguinity Two degrees of relation from whom the member is seeking eligibility. Furthest allowable relationship is grandmother or granddaughter. Great or great-great-granddaughters cannot join the Auxiliary. Current members whose eligibility relationship is great-granddaughter, great great-granddaughter or direct descendent can continue being a member, as long as their dues are kept current. If a member whose eligibility relationship is great-granddaughter, great-great-granddaughter or direct descendent, they may reinstate their membership only by payment of back dues for all years of delinquency or by establishing new eligibility.

9. True: There are 2 circumstances where a person could join the ALA without having a current member of the American Legion. There are two circumstances when a woman can become a member without having a relative as a current member of The American Legion. The first circumstance would be when the woman has served in the military during the requisite dates. She may join the ALA without being a member of the Legion. The second circumstance is when membership is based on a deceased veteran who was not a member of The American Legion; however, the American Legion Auxiliary Department Operations Guide Chapter 8: Membership Page 17 prospective member will be required to provide verifying documentation of the deceased relative's service dates to prove ALA eligibility.



IDEAS TO HELP VETERANS DURING THE HOLIDAYS



The holiday season is right around the corner, and it's important to show veterans extra love and appreciation during these cold winter months. This time of year can be especially hard on veterans who may not have family close by, or it's difficult for family and friends to visit due to veterans being in an assisted living facility or hospital. It's our duty as American Legion Auxiliary members to answer the call of *Service Not Self*, and help our isolated veterans feel loved and valued this holiday season.

There are so many ways to engage with veterans who may be alone during the holidays. Gather members of your ALA unit and help the veterans in your community feel appreciated.

For homebound veterans

- Bring them homemade goodies and snacks.
- Make a casserole each week and drop it off at their home.
- Bring over crafts, crossword puzzles, Sudoku worksheets, magazines, books, etc., to keep them busy during the long winter.
- Write them thoughtful cards explaining how grateful you are for them and thank them for their service.
- Gift them a stocking stuffer for Christmas filled with things they enjoy or need.
- Bring them hats, gloves, scarves, warm socks, throw blankets, etc.
- Give them streamers for New Year's and a new calendar.
- Organize a meal train.
- Pick up their groceries or send groceries through Instacart.
- Help with any errands they may have.
- Focus on conversation and companionship.
- Lend a helping hand in any way you can.

For veterans in assisted living facilities

- Contact a local facility to see what items are allowed inside it won't be the case for every location but at least asking will give an idea of what's allowed and what kind of things would really benefit veterans during those harder months.
- Send a care package that includes the items that are allowed. A few popular examples are playing cards, puzzle books, journals, pens, lip balm, fuzzy socks, a knitted scarf, specialty teas, a handmade drawing, a handmade card, an appreciative letter, etc.
- Try visiting a veteran once a week.
- Play cards with them.
- Do something creative together like painting or drawing.
- Be a listening ear with a thankful heart.

For VA residential home or hospitalized veterans

- Work with your local U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs residential home or VA medical center to see how you can help veterans staying there. Ask the VA what you can bring to benefit veterans living there.
- Depending on their protocols, try visiting once a week.
- Ask ALA Junior members to draw pictures and bring the artwork to veterans at the VA.
- Give them a thank-you card, and Christmas and New Year's Day cards.
- Bring them magazines from The American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary.
- Gift them puzzles and books for entertainment. Keep them company.
- Show them kindness and compassion. You may be the only person visiting them during the holidays, so make a positive impact.
