Hobart sought the national presidency during the Auxiliary's first National Convention in 1921. She was one of 10 women who ran in the election. She remained active and involved in the ALA after completing her term as national president. Prior to taking national office, Hobart was known for following her enlisted son to military

HELLO!

I would like to introduce you to an agenda form that is used on the National level and is being used more on the Department and District level. It is called Consent Agenda. It is used to make meetings go quicker so items of importance have time to be discussed. It's a long read but could make your meeting more productive.

GOVERNANCE

The American Legion Auxiliary utilizes the consent agenda in the course of conducting the business meetings of the National Executive Committee. A consent agenda, also called a consent calendar in Roberts Rules of Order, is a standard good governance practice utilized by large organizations to expedite its business proceedings. The main purpose of a consent agenda is to bundle into a single action item the routine procedures, administrative details, and self-explanatory matters that the board normally approves without discussion or debate. A consent agenda allows the board to approve such items together without discussion or individual motions.

Because questions or comments on these items are not allowed during the meeting, utilizing a consent agenda frees up valuable time for the board to discuss more substantial agenda items.

A consent agenda is a single item on the board's meeting agenda, typically the first action item, and is voted upon with a single vote — a vote to approve the consent agenda by unanimous consent. Unless a board member feels that an item should be discussed and requests the removal of that item ahead of time, the entire package is voted on in one motion without additional explanations

or comments.

A typical consent agenda contains items that are routine or procedural and generally noncontroversial.

Typical consent agenda items include routine matters such as the approval of the minutes; committee appointments requiring board ratification or confirmation; approval of proposals or reports with which the board is familiar; reports provided for information only; correspondence requiring no action; minor changes in a procedure; routine revisions of a policy; confirmation of conventional actions that may be required in an organization's bylaws; and other matters historically adopted without controversy. Such items are combined into one action item for approval – the consent agenda.

The use of the consent agenda requires that the board be provided with the consent agenda and materials pertinent to the consent agenda in advance of the board meeting.

Items on the consent agenda are not discussed individually. At the beginning of the meeting, the chair will if a voting member wishes, remove any removed from the consent agenda and discussed individually. If a voting member believes an item on the consent agenda warrants full board discussion, she may request its removal, and the chair will remove the item from the consent agenda. The chair then determines whether to take up the matter immediately or place it on the regular meeting agenda. If there are no items to be removed or when there are no further items to be removed, the numbers or titles of the remaining consent agenda items are read. The chair then states: "If there is no objection, these items will be adopted." After pausing for any objections, the chair states "As there are no objections, these items are adopted. Adopting a consent agenda does not require a show of hands, your silence by not objecting is giving consent.

If clarification of a consent agenda item is needed by an individual, the clarification should be requested before the meeting. The item would not be pulled from the consent agenda if an individual question can be answered prior to the start of the meeting.

We are asking that all Units and Districts share a copy of their Constitution and Bylaws with the Department C & B Committee. If you already have sent a copy to Department that is wonderful.
